# THE AMATEUR SQUASH CHAMPIONSHIPS JESTERS TROPHY 2010

The Amateur Championships started in 1922 and past winners included many notable players – F.D.Amr Bey (Egypt) who won it 6 times in the 1930's, Jonah Barrington (Ireland) winning it 3 times and Geoff Hunt (Australia)

But in 1979 top players wanted to be paid and become professionals so the 'Amateur' would be no more. The last match in 1980 saw Jonny Leslie (England) beat Ross Norman (NZ) 3/0 at Wembley Squash Club.

However one man ignored this march of time and decided to carry on running the British Amateur Championships. That man was Peter Chalk, or 'Chalky' as he is affectionately known to all and sundry. This year he will have notched up an amazing 30 years running the event, now called 'The Jesters Trophy', without

This year, as it has been since 2005, the events were held at the RAC, Pall Mall and were run over the weekend of 30/31

January with the finals being played on Monday 1st February. Following the finals all participants enjoyed a glorious buffet supper put on by the RAC but, we suspect, heavily subsidised by Chalky.


All finalists are members of the Veterans Squash Club of Great Britain.



### **WORLD MASTERS GAMES - SYDNEY OCTOBER 2009**

2 Gold and 2 Silver Medals for GB Vets

Only three GB Vets made the trip to Sydney last October and all came away with hardware. Over 400 squash players registered for the tournament. Due to the small numbers in both the 70-74 and 75-79 Open sections the players were divided into two groups of 3 or 4 players. The winners of each groups then played off for the Gold and Silver medals. The big surprise for the UK competitors when they got to the venue was the scoring system, it was PAR to 11.

**Malcolm Gilham** playing in the 75-79 led his group with two comfortable 3-0 wins, unfortunately picking up a shoulder injury in his second match. In the play-off, nursing a well strapped shoulder, Malcolm won quite comfortably (3-0) picking up the Gold medal.

**Tom Hannon** and **Brian Phillips** played in the 70-74's in separate groups; Tom's group proved to be just a little too strong for him and he

went down 3-1 and 3-0. In the other Group Brian managed to win two out of three games which, with the scoring system in place, put Brian at the top of the Group. In the play off Brian had a 3-2 win and picked up the Gold medal.

A good week was rounded off by Team GB gaining sufficient points to win silver in the O55's.

### Footnote:

The Games was a massive event being larger than the Games in Edmonton 4 years earlier, with a total of over 28,000 competitors across all sports. These numbers caused considerable problems for the organisers during registration and parading for the opening ceremony with long delays for both.

### **EAST OF ENGLAND...** BURY ST EDMUNDS – 25-27 September 2009

### Women's

**O50.** 4 GB Vets – **Sue Pynegar**, **Lynne Davies**, **Karen Hume** and **Kath Kemp** – competed in a round robin. **Lynne** was the overall winner having won a crucial match against **Karen** 3/2. **Karen** was second and **Sue** third.

#### Men's

- **O50. Ian Bradburn** powered his way to winning the final.
- O55. No.1 seed Mark Cowley's court speed and pace was just too good for Stuart Hardy in the final.
- O60. Howard Cherlin beat Martin Pearse in the semis and Barry Featherstone beat Larry Grover in the other semi. Howard, No 1 seed, despite an overdose of Merlot, proved too clever and his variations of pace too much for Barry in the final.
- O65. Adrian Wright, beat 'the Don' Len Froggitt in the semis and Mike Clemson beat Graham Fisher in the other. Adrian's power and determination edged it 3/2 in the final.
- **O70.** Malcolm Gilham sneaked past Lance Kinder 3/1. At the other end Irishman Tom Hannon took out Tony Seare. The final saw Tom take a 2/0 lead over Malcolm then lose the next two, but took the fifth 9/5.

### Women's

**O50.** New GB Vet **Jane Law** beat 30x world and national champion **Bett Dryhurst** 10/9 in the 4th in the first round and then lost in the semis. Newcomer **Lynne Davies** beat **Karen Hume** in the other semi but lost in the final.

### Men's

- **O45.** Mark Hildred pushed **Eamonn Price** in the 1/4's but **Eamonn** won another Regional title 3/1 of which 3 games went to 10.
- **O50. Peter Alexander**, although eligible for the O55's, found life hard and lost to **Ian Bradburn** in the semis. **Chris Harland** won the other semi only to lose 3/1 to **Ian** in the final.
- **O55. Peter Leary** seeded 2, lost to **Mike Tidy** in the first round. **Mike** then removed **Alastair Niven** but lost in the semis. In the other half of the draw **Stuart Hardy** sneaked past **Paul Reader** 3/2 but then lost in the semis to the eventual winner **Keith Jones**.
